Introduction to the Asian Mind Sports Festival and Context on the Asian Mind Sports Association (AMSA)

An earlier version of this was presented at the 2025 APBF Delegates Meeting on 16 May 2025.

This has since been updated after discussion with APBF and with AMSA.

Purpose

The Singapore Contract Bridge Association (SCBA), in collaboration with the Asian Mind Sports Association (AMSA), will be co-hosting the inaugural Asian Mind Sports Festival this November in Singapore. Given the potential for this event to serve as a stepping stone for future regional and multi-sport mind sports competitions, I would like to take this opportunity to brief APBF delegates on the broader context in which this Festival is being held.

Background of Asian Mind Sports Association (AMSA)

While SCBA is not part of the governance of AMSA, we understand that the Asian Mind Sports Association is a newly established regional body aimed at unifying and advancing the development of mind sports across Asia.

AMSA was officially launched at a meeting in Bangkok on 25 February 2025, attended by 29 National Olympic Committees. Its creation reflects growing interest in institutionalising mind sports—such as bridge, chess, go, draughts, and xiangqi — in a similar fashion to physical sports, particularly within the framework of the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA).

AMSA is <u>recognised by OCA</u>. In addition, the International Mind Sports Association (IMSA) President has <u>pledged support for AMSA</u>. (IMSA is indirectly linked to the International Olympic Committee).

Headquartered in Singapore, AMSA's objectives include:

- Promoting awareness and participation in mind sports across Asia;
- Coordinating regional events and fostering cross-discipline collaboration;
- Representing the interests of mind sports at the continental level; and
- Standardising rules and ethics for fair play across its member disciplines.
- Leading, planning and organising the 1st Asian Esports and Mind Sports Games in 2027 and future editions thereafter. The Asian Esports and Mind Sports Games will provide a regular and definite feature of mind sports in OCA's major games.

Although SCBA is not directly affiliated with AMSA's leadership, we recognise its establishment as a potentially significant development for the regional bridge community, particularly as mind sports gain visibility within the multi-sport ecosystem.

The 2025 Asian Mind Sports Festival – A Collaborative Initiative

To this end, SCBA is partnering with AMSA to organise the Asian Mind Sports Festival, to be held from 13-15 November 2025 at Suntec City, Singapore. The Festival will provide a good reference and benchmark for the 1st Asian Esports and Mind Sports Games in 2027.

Within the APBF ecosystem, this event remains one that is privately organised by the SCBA and receives no special treatment by APBF compared to other well-known events organised by individual NBOs around the region. However, that will change should this be "upgraded" to a Major Game by OCA and by extension each National Olympic Committees within Asia.

Bridge Component Overview

The Bridge segment of the Festival will include the following categories:

- Men's Teams event and Pairs event
- Women's Teams event and Pairs event

Each category will consist of:

- 6 teams of four to six members (for Team events) and 12 pairs (for Pair events), drawn from 5 invited NBOs, selected based on performance at recent regional BFAME and APBF championships, ensuring at least one NBO from each OCA Zone as much as possible.
- Singapore will participate as host but will not take a spot in the Southeast Asia (OCA Zone
 5) quota.

Proposed format for Pairs will be 10 rounds, 7 boards per round, scissors movement (no playoffs). Pairs from the same country will not be facing each other.

Proposed format for Teams will be double round robin, 10 rounds, 8 boards per round, scored by IMPs converted to VPs (no playoffs). Teams can consist of up to 6 athletes, but if so, this means two players will not be playing in the Pairs event.

There will be a game for Locals on Friday night and Saturday morning. The format has not yet been determined.

Four sets of gold, silver, and bronze medals will be provided in total, and the total prize pool is \$\$7,000. To make the Festival more appealing, each participating NBO from overseas will receive a small subsidy per participating team.

Schedule Summary:

- 10-12 Nov: Venue setup (not all days have to be utilised)
- 13-14 Nov: Pairs competition
- 14-15 Nov: Teams competition and prize giving

Appendix A: Event Details

(Note that everything is TBC pending admin approval from AMSA.)

1. Objective

To demonstrate a proof of concept for a combined mind sports festival that will lead to the 1st Asian Esports and Mind Sports Games in 2027 and future editions thereafter, eventually evolving into a recurring Major Games event for Asia.

2. Organisers

The Festival is jointly organised by the Singapore Contract Bridge Association (SCBA) and the Asian Mind Sports Association (AMSA).

SCBA and AMSA will oversee bridge operations and playing logistics. Discussions are ongoing with APBF and BFAME to ensure alignment, as future editions of the Festival may involve broader regional participation.

3. Venue and Dates

• Location: Suntec City, Singapore

• Event Dates: 13-15 November 2025

Setup Dates: 10-12 November 2025 (not all days will be fully utilised)

4. Competition Format

a) Events:

- Men's Pairs
- Women's Pairs
- Men's Teams
- Women's Teams

Due to venue constraints and concurrent scheduling with other mind sports, these four events are the only categories included.

Each event will feature:

- 6 Teams (1 per NBO)
- 12 Pairs (2 per NBO)

An NBO may be invited for either the men's or women's events — or both — based on performance.

b) Pairs Format

- 2 pairs per NBO per category
- Scissors movement (pairs from the same NBO will not play each other)

- 10 rounds, 7 boards per round
- No playoffs (in line with other mind sports at the Festival)

c) Teams Format

- 1 team (4-6 players) per NBO per category
- Double round-robin, 10 rounds
- 8 boards per round, scored by IMPs converted to VPs
- No playoffs (in line with other mind sports at the Festival)

5. Awards

Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals will be awarded for each of the four events. A combined medal tally across all events (including those from other mind sports competed in the Festival) may be maintained.

6. Participation and Subsidy:

There is no entry fee.

To assist with travel and accommodation costs, participating NBOs will receive a subsidy of S\$600 per category (e.g. S\$600 to the NBO for men's participation, S\$1,200 if both men's and women's from the same NBO participate).

NBOs are to arrange their own flights and accommodation.

7. NBO Invitation Criteria

a) General Principle:

SCBA will decide on the teams to invite using the recent APBF and BFAME results.

To reflect Major Games conventions, there is no "Open" category – only distinct Men's and Women's categories. The Open category results will be used as a proxy for the Men's category.

Each OCA Zone will be represented as far as possible. If an NBO declines, the invitation will pass to the next best-performing NBO from the same zone in their regional championships (playoff results will be counted). If no teams from a zone can attend, the spot will be reallocated to the next best NBO from the relevant regional championship (e.g. BFAME or APBF), and thereafter to the other WBF Zone if necessary.

b) Zone-Specific Allocation:

For OCA Zones 1 and 3, the results are confirmed based on their recent BFAME Trials:
